

Rationale Behind the Rules

- Ensure the <u>integrity and fairness</u> of the exam system.
- Ensure <u>alignment to rules</u> and regulations set by SEAB for national exams.



MEASURES FOR CONTAGIOUS DISEASES

E.G. CHICKEN POX, HFMD, COVID-19



Important Updates

- Students who are
 - On medical leave & unwell with fever or flulike symptoms,
 - On medical leave & unwell with contagious diseases e.g. chicken pox, HFMD

should inform the school (CT, CTA & subject tutor) & not sit for any school-based examinations.

 Students <u>may</u> wear a face mask <u>during</u> the written exam.

Important Updates to COVID Protocols

- If a student tests Positive for Covid, do online reporting immediately (https://www.tinyurl.com/covidsajc) and the submitted photo of ART Kit with name/date can be valid just like MC for up to 5 Days inclusive of date of infection.
- Inform the school (CT, CTA & subject tutor)
- The student may return to school (even for Exams) once he/she feels well without needing to do another ART. However, he/she should practice good social responsibility by wearing mask.
- Hence, these students can still take exams once they feel well. However, if they are symptomatic, they will be asked to leave the school, including during exams.

Contagious Diseases

- See a qualified medical practitioner and inform your CT, CTA & subject tutor immediately
- Do not come to school until you have clearance from a doctor
- Examples of contagious diseases: HFMD, shingles, chicken pox etc



STANDARD RULES FOR SCHOOL-BASED EXAMS

Attire

 Students may wear PE T-shirt + College bottoms (Half U) for practical examinations and for all written examinations.

Absence from Exam

- All absences have to be covered by a valid medical certificate / ART test (for Covid-19). Letter of excuses are NOT accepted.
- Inform your CT, CTA & subject tutor before the exam.
- No mark will be awarded for students who are absent without an approved valid reason.
- The above is the same procedure for WA
- Absence from exam may affect the eligibility for awards and scholarships.

You will be given <u>full duration</u> to sit for the exam



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



Writing of Name

- You are given <u>1 minute</u> to write your name before the commencement of the paper. Only write your name when instructed to do so.
- You are <u>not allowed</u> to write your name after the end of the paper.
 - In line with updated SEAB exam rules
 - Difficult to monitor if students are really writing names

Stop Writing Announcement

 At the stop writing announcement, stop writing and put down your pen immediately

For school-based Exams

- First time offenders: deduction of marks
- Repeat offenders:
 - Zero marks for the subject
 - Parents to meet P
 - "Fair" for conduct grade

Irregularities

Severe:

- Cheating
- Continuing to write after paper has ended
- Communicating with others
- Writing/ Reading before paper begins

Others:

- Improper attire / grooming
- Did not present proof of identity
- Eating (only plain water is allowed, unless student has applied for Access Arrangement)

Irregularities Reported Last Year


- Students entering the exam venue, putting down the bags then leaving to go toilet.
- Latecomer not reporting to invigilator to mark attendance.
- Continuing to write after time is up.
- Students talking while scripts were being collected.

Calculators and E-dictionaries

- Any enclosed instruction leaflets that come with the calculator must NOT be brought into the exam venue.
- Only use approved models and ensure model number is clearly visible
 - Refer to SEAB website / Rules & Regulations
 - List of approved calculators: pg 28
 - Steps to reset GC: pg 28 31

Note: During exams, you will not be allowed to use your GC if you do not know how to reset GC.



3.1 You must not have in your possession:

- 3.1.1 Any unauthorised electronic, communication, smart or computerised devices within the examination premises (e.g. examination venue, quarantine room, waiting room).
 Examples of unauthorised devices include but are not limited to:
 - Computerised devices
 - Tablet
 - Pocket PC
 - Personal Digital Assistant
 - Digital diary
 - eBook
 - Smart devices
 - Smart watch
 - Smart glasses
 - Fitness tracker

- Communication devices
 - o Mobile phone
 - Smart watch
 - Earphones
- Other Electronic devices
 - Camera
 - o Audio recorder / player
 - Gaming device
 - Storage device

3.1.2 Any unauthorised materials

Examples of unauthorised materials include but are not limited to:

- Question paper from previous examination
- Writing paper
- Sticky note
- Book

- Entry proof from previous examinations
- Notes / reference material
- Conversion table / Formulae sheet in mathematical set or calculator cover

All stationery / belongings taken into the examination venue (e.g. pencil case, calculator(s), mathematical set, ruler, entry proof) must not have any unauthorised notes / information written on them.



- Any form of communication is not allowed inside or outside the exam venue throughout the entire examination process.
- Don't write any offensive or obscene materials in the scripts.
- Examination materials such as <u>used or unused</u> answer booklets and writing papers should NOT be removed from the examination venue.
- Do not flip open / turn over the question paper until told to do so.

Before Exam

- For morning papers, report to the assembly venue.
- For afternoon papers, report at the Exam Venue at least 30 minutes before the commencement of the examination.
- All latecomers to report to the invigilator. No make-up time will be given for latecomers.
- Check Seating Plan.
- Switch off handphones and place in your bag.
- Put your bag inside the exam venue.

When Inside Exam Venue

- Observe <u>absolute silence</u> when inside the exam venue
- Place <u>student pass</u> or <u>NRIC</u> on the desks
- Only start writing or reading when told to do so by an invigilator
- Stay for the entire exam duration. Don't leave the exam venue to go toilet during the last 15 minutes of the exam.
- Raise your hands to get the attention of the invigilator to visit the toilet.
